Supporting you

We want you to make the most of your time in our Sixth Form. We have an incredible team to support all aspects of your time in school.

Our Sixth Form Support Officer, Mrs Jarvis, plays a crucial role in ensuring the success and well-being of our students. As the first point of contact, she provides a welcoming and approachable presence, ready to assist with any questions or concerns. With expertise and care, she triages students, directing them to the appropriate support services, whether it be counseling, academic assistance, or careers advice.

YOUR GUIDE

To Sixth Form Study

Independent Study

In Sixth Form, you're expected to take ownership of your learning and manage your time effectively. Independent study happens outside of lessons and plays a vital role in your academic success. This includes:

- Homework and coursework
- Consolidation of class content
- Revision and exam preparation

A good rule of thumb is to spend at least 5 hours per subject per week on independent study.

Guided Study (GST)

Guided Study sessions are timetabled, silent, and supervised study periods designed to help you extend your learning beyond the classroom. These sessions provide the space and structure for focused academic work, and attendance is compulsory.

You'll be expected to use this time to:

- Reinforce your understanding of recent lessons
- Tackle more advanced or challenging tasks
- Complete wider reading or subject-specific research
- Revise key concepts and prepare for assessments

Think of Guided Study as an opportunity to add colour and depth to your understanding. It's where you can take your classroom learning further, explore new ideas, and really challenge yourself.

Supercurricular

Supercurricular activities go beyond the A-level syllabus and allow you to deepen your subject knowledge, explore your interests, and develop the kind of intellectual curiosity that top universities and employers value. These experiences show that you're actively engaging with your subject and not just studying it. They can also help shape future aspirations and provide excellent material for personal statements, interviews, and CVs. Try exploring through:

- Academic reading, journals, or subject-related books
- Lectures, webinars, and university taster sessions
- Podcasts, documentaries, or research articles
- Competitions, workshops, and keeping up with current developments

NEXT STEPS

preparing for Sixth Form

Digital access to lesson resources is a key part of Sixth Form learning, and all students are required to have a laptop that is fully charged and brought to school every day, including all lessons, Guided Study and Independent Study sessions. To support this, we have outlined minimum laptop specifications to ensure all students have a device suitable for effective study. Laptops should be used responsibly and for academic purposes while in school. When on site, always connect to the school Wi-Fi, as all activity is monitored and protected by secure filtering systems to provide a safe digital environment. In line with the school's mobile phone policy, Sixth Form students may only use mobile phones, smart watches and earbuds within the Manor. These devices must not be used in the main school building, corridors, library or while moving around the site unless specifically authorised by a member of staff for educational purposes. Any device used outside these expectations may be confiscated and will need to be collected from the Sixth Form Office at the end of the day. Repeated misuse may result in further sanctions in line with the school's Behaviour Policy.

LAPTOP MINIMUM SPECIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

Screen type	A touchscreen is essential
Keyboard and stylus	The device must have a keyboard, either built in or detached A stylus is required
Screen size	We would recommend screens are a minimum of 11" so that students can make effective use of the tools available
Processor	Intel Core i3 or equivalent
RAM	Minimum 8GB.
Local Storage	Minimum 120GB (1TB of cloud storage is provided free via the school Microsoft account).
Battery life	Battery life to last a school day on a single charge (46 W/hrs is a useful benchmark, noting as batteries age, their life declines)
Wireless network	Dual Band 802.11a/b/g/ac/n Students will be expected to connect to the school network through BYOD
Camera	A front camera (essential), back camera (recommended)
Accessories	In ear headphones are required. Note: cabled options are cheaper and less likely to get lost. A power bank for emergency charging is also recommended. We would strongly recommend a protective case
Antivirus	The device must be maintained with up-to-date antivirus software. Windows Defender, which comes inbuilt with Windows 10/11 is a good product so long as it is kept up-to-date. If you would like to install a third party Anti-Virus, then this too must be kept up-to-date.
Operating system	SGGS is a Microsoft school, therefore the operating system (OS) should be Windows 11 recommended or Windows 10 or Apple iOS, as staff and students will be using Microsoft. Please note, Windows 10 will no longer be supported from 14th October 2025. The school does not support Chrome / Android OS, so we cannot guarantee compatibility of these devices with our IT systems, including Wi-Fi.

YOUR DIGITAL SET UP

OneNote & OneDrive

OneNote is an essential tool to help you keep your Sixth Form learning structured, accessible, and ready for revision. It allows you to store all your lesson notes, Independent, Guided, Supercurricular Study, and wider reading in one place, accessible from any device. With simple tagging and search features, it's easy to stay organised and manage your studies effectively.

Your subject teachers may set up OneNote Class Notebooks with a specific layout to support how each subject is taught. Always follow their guidance first. If you are creating your own independent notebook, start by setting up clear sections for each subject area or topic. For example, a History notebook might include: Tudors, Cold War, Coursework, Guided Study, Supercurricular, and Homework & Deadlines. Within each section, use logically labelled pages to break down content such as lesson notes, timelines, or wider reading, and use subpages to keep related items neatly grouped.

Create a space to log your independent study either as one central Study Journal with pages for homework, Guided Study time, and Supercurricular work, or include these logs within each subject section. This helps you reflect on how you're using your time and builds useful evidence of progress, ideal for discussions with teachers or drafting personal statements.

Tags and the search function make revision easier. Label key ideas using tags such as "To Do," "Important," or your own system (for example, "SC" for supercurricular), and use the search bar to find them quickly. These habits help keep your learning focused and organised.

Your OneNote notebooks sync automatically with OneDrive, so your work is always backed up. Organise your OneDrive with the same structure as your OneNote: create folders by subject and topic, and name files clearly and consistently (for example, Economics_MarketFailure_Essay_Oct2025). Delete old drafts regularly to keep things tidy and always check your sync settings by selecting File, then Info, then View Sync Status.

Getting into these habits early will save you time, reduce stress, and help you become a more independent learner. Organised students are more confident, proactive, and better prepared for the challenges of Sixth Form.

A full guide to using OneNote and OneDrive will be made available on the Sixth Form Team in September. Additionally, a drop-in session will be held early in term where you can ask questions and get help with OneNote and digital learning tools.

YOUR SCHOOL DAY *& expectations*

Attendance and registration

We expect all students to attend 100% of lessons, Tutorial, assemblies, and enrichment activities. This includes events, trips, and work experience directed by the school.

- Morning registration is taken during Tutorial at 08:55. You must be on site by 08:50.
- You will also be registered in each lesson.
- Use the fingerprint scanner to register if arriving late or not in a timetabled session.
- Absence must be reported by a parent by 9:00am via the My Child at School app. This includes illness or sickness.
- Full-day absences will not be authorised without prior consent from SGGS.
- For medical or dental appointments, advance notice is required. We encourage these to take place outside school hours wherever possible. If appointments must be in school time, students should be out for the minimum time necessary.

All attendance is monitored and must follow our published Attendance Policy, available on the SGGS website.

Assemblies & Tutorial Time

- Whole School Assembly: once per half term
- House Assemblies: fortnightly
- Year Group Assemblies: held throughout the year
- Sixth Form Assembly: every Tuesday morning
- On non-assembly days, Tutorial is used for PSHE, notices, and discussions that build community and support your Personal Development.

Why Attendance Matters

Consistently high attendance improves academic success and wellbeing. Even after turning 18, full-time students are still classed as children under safeguarding law, so these policies apply throughout your time at SGGS.

OFFSITE STUDY

& University visits

Offsite study

We encourage Sixth Formers to use Independent Study time wisely - whether on-site or off-site - as an opportunity to extend learning beyond the classroom.

Year 13 students may request up to two off-site sessions per week from the start of term.

Year 12 students must demonstrate high levels of independence and an attendance rate of 95% or above before off-site is considered. This will be no earlier than October, and always subject to individual review.

All off-site study requests must be approved in advance by Mrs Jarvis, our Sixth Form Support Officer, and students must sign out with the Sixth Form Office before leaving the site. Changes to off-site arrangements cannot be made without prior authorisation.

Off-site study is for academic purposes only. It may not be used for external employment, private tutoring, or other non-study activities. Students are expected to work in a quiet, home-based environment that supports focused independent learning.

Please note: off-site study is suspended during whole-school events, including the Winter House Festival, Sports Day and the Year 7–10 Awards Afternoon. All students are expected to be present on-site during such occasions.

Open Days

You are permitted to take TWO days out of school for visiting universities in Year 12. You can request permission for this via email to Mrs Jarvis. Year 13 should only be missing school for university selection days not open days. If you do need to visit a university in Year 13 you must seek permission from Dr Griffiths.

SIXTH FORM

dress code

At SGGS, Sixth Form students are expected to wear business-style clothing that reflects a professional working environment. Your appearance should support a focused atmosphere, uphold our high standards, and show pride in our community. Staff will advise if clothing is not appropriate.

Blazer or Tailored Jacket

- Must be worn at all times in school
- Smart knitwear may be worn underneath
- Jumpers/cardigans cannot replace a blazer

Shirts and Tops

- Smart blouses, buttoned or collared tops
- Must not reveal shoulders, midriff, or cleavage
- No backless, strappy, graphic or slogan t-shirts

Trousers / Skirts / Dresses

- Tailored trousers, skirts or dresses
- Skirts and dresses: knee-length or longer than fingertips
- Not allowed: bodycon, jersey, maxi skirts/dresses, denim, leather, chinos, leggings, shorts

Footwear

- Smart, closed-toe flat or low-heeled shoes/ankle boots (heels < 5cm)
- Not allowed: trainers (unless you have a medical need; please pop into the SF office to discuss), flip-flops, knee-high boots, or casual shoes.

Socks / Tights

- **Plain and professional**
- **No lace, patterns or over-the-knee styles**

Knitwear

- Optional under a blazer
- Must be plain and smart
- No logos, hoodies or sportswear

Jewellery & Makeup

- Modest, suitable for a working environment
- One pair of fashion earrings only
- Additional ear piercings: studs only
- No facial piercings (unless authorised for cultural/religious reasons)

Hair

- Neat and professional
- No extreme styles or colours
- Long hair must be tied back for practical subjects

Coats

- Coats can be worn to/from school
- Must be removed in classrooms and corridors
- Store coats in the Manor cloakrooms

Staying informed

As a Sixth Form student, you are expected to take responsibility for keeping up to date with school news, events, and important information. Communication happens through the following channels:

SGGS Email

Your sggs.org.uk email is the main channel of communication. Check it at the start and end of each day. Staff will use this to contact you directly.

Microsoft Teams

Key messages, shared files, and Sixth Form notices will appear here, including the weekly Sixth Form bulletin, also emailed to parents/carers on Fridays.

MCAS and Bromcom Portals

We are now using Bromcom to share key academic information.

- Students must download the Bromcom Student Portal app at the start of Year 12.
- Parents must download the MCAS Bromcom Parent Portal.

These platforms are essential for viewing exam timetables, results, and reports. Students and parents/carers will not receive paper copies.

Tutor Time & Assemblies

Announcements and reminders are also shared in morning tutorials and assemblies. Please be present, punctual, and engaged.

Getting to School: driving & parking

We know many of you will start driving during Sixth Form. However, there is no student parking on site. Instead, Sixth Formers may use the Anne Hathaway's Cottage car park, just a short walk away. This is funded by the school and arranged in partnership with the local community. To get your parking permit, speak to Mrs Jarvis in the Sixth Form Office. Please do not park outside local homes even where it's permitted; it causes inconvenience and undermines our positive relationship with neighbours.

Lockers

Lockers are available to rent annually through Independent Locker Solutions (ILS).

- Cost: £32 per year (September–July, no part-year discount)

The Manor is equipped with six dedicated study rooms: Hathaway, Venice, Shakespeare, Study Room (a study space which can be booked), Arden, and Verona, providing students with quiet and focused environments for Independent and collaborative study. Additional amenities include toilet facilities and a fully equipped kitchen, featuring a fridge, microwave, kettle, and water cooler, allowing students to heat their lunch and make hot drinks. The centre also hosts The Dairy, a Sixth Form café service available during break and lunch times, where students can purchase food and drinks using a convenient finger scan system linked to ParentPay.

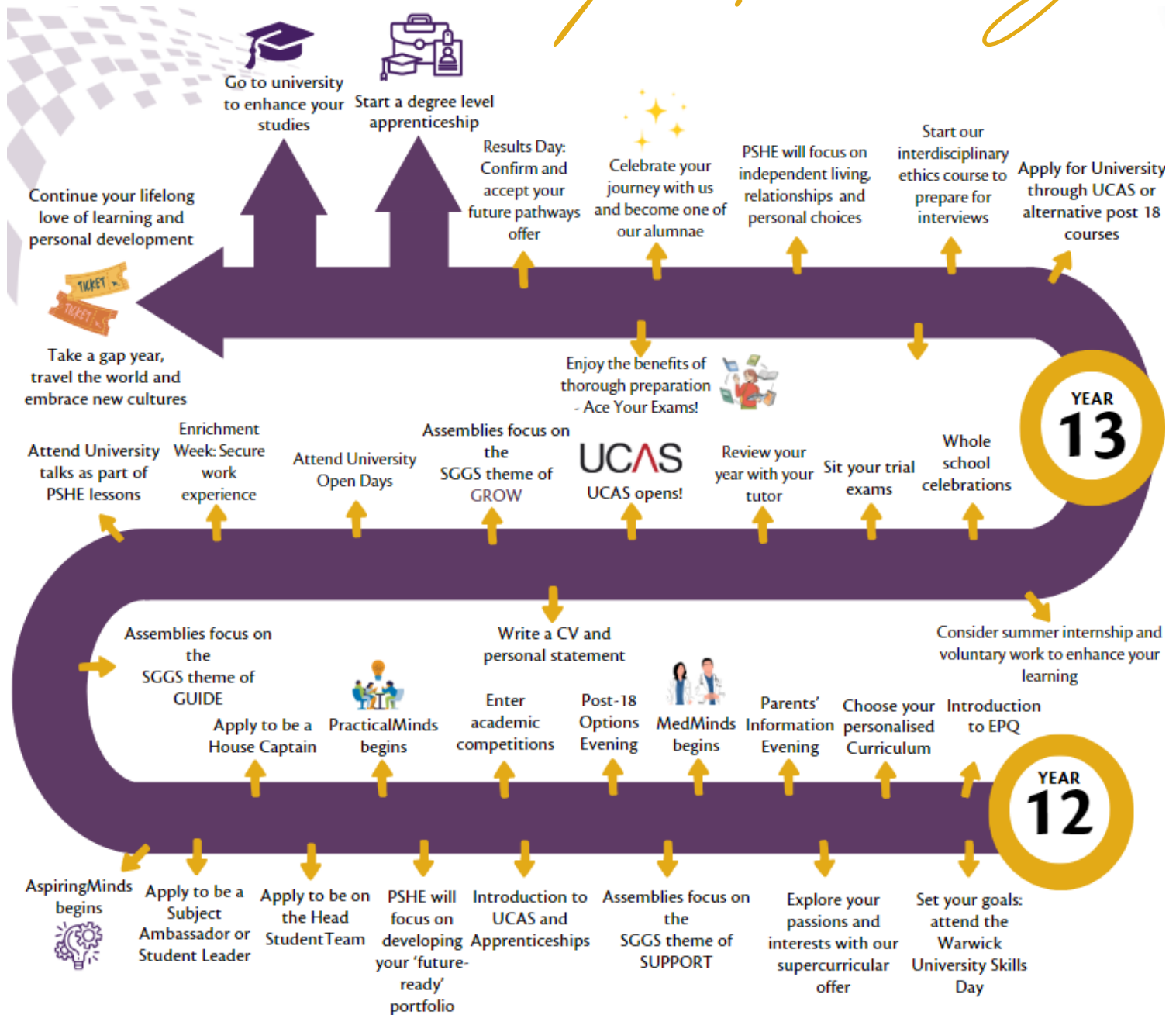

FUTURES-ENABLING PROGRAMMES

supporting your Sixth Form journey

AspiringMinds

This programme is aimed at students wishing to apply through the highly selective Oxbridge application process. This starts in March with a visiting speaker from Oxford's Keble College and then there will be a series of sessions designed to stimulate and challenge students to prepare for the rigour of the application and interview process. The programme will also provide students with an opportunity to hear from our SGGS alumnae who are currently studying at the University of Oxford and Cambridge.

MedMinds

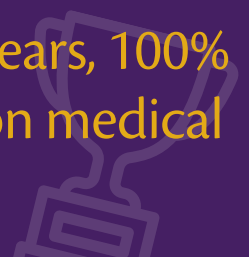
MedMinds is an extensive programme to support students wishing to apply for Medicine, Dentistry, or Veterinary Science. Students will be taken through practical and discussion-based activities and also learn about the profession from a number of visiting speakers specialising in different aspects of Medicine. The course is designed to encourage students to broaden their portfolios and create evidence for a competitive Personal Statement.

PracticalMinds

Students who are interested in pursuing a degree apprenticeship will be led through a number of sessions which will help to support them with applying for apprenticeship vacancies and preparing them for the recruitment process used by employers. The programme provides students with the opportunity to hear from local employers about their apprenticeship opportunities and SGGS alumnae who have taken the Degree Apprenticeship pathway since leaving SGGS.

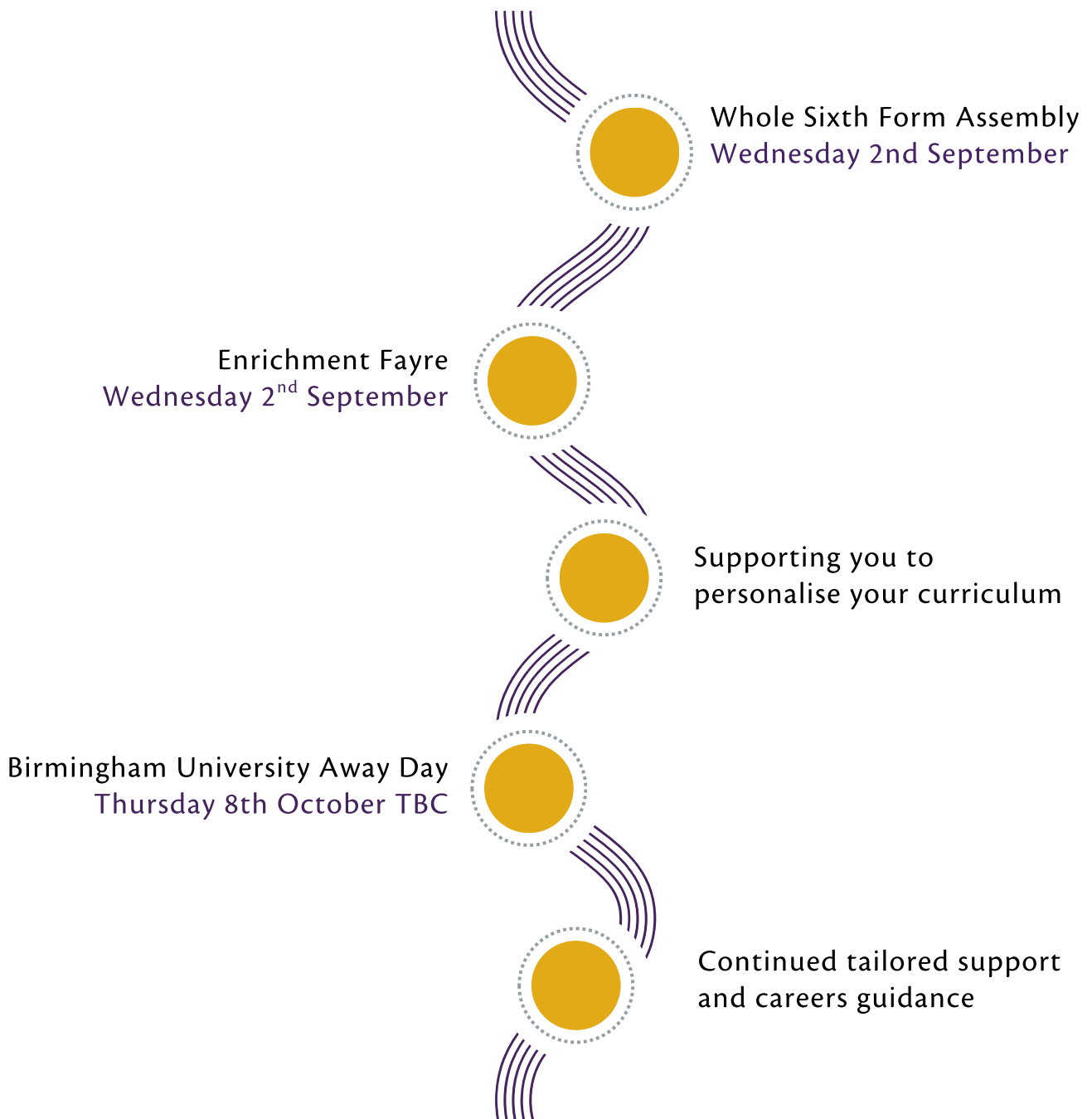
